

**TOWN OF YARMOUTH
RESIDENT BEACH STICKER REGULATIONS – 10/2019**

1. A resident beach sticker purchased at the Town Clerk's Office at town hall is \$35.00 with a second one to the same household/address being \$35.00 and any subsequent sticker is \$35.00. A resident beach sticker purchased online or through the mail is \$30.00 with a second one to the same household/address being \$30.00 and any subsequent beach sticker purchased online or through the mail is \$30.00. A resident beach sticker purchased at the Chamber of Commerce is \$38.00 with a second one to be the same household/address being \$38.00 and any subsequent sticker is \$38.00. The resident beach sticker is a non-transferable and non-refundable parking permit.
2. To obtain a resident beach sticker, you must present a valid motor vehicle registration. If leased vehicle, a copy of a lease must be provided.
3. A Vehicle Purchase & Sales Agreement is not valid proof of registration.
4. HP, HP placard, D.A.V, and EX-POW plates may obtain a sticker for a \$1.00 service fee. Honorably Discharged veterans that possess a DD214 document will receive a 20% discount.
5. Residents entitled to a sticker must comply with the Residency Policy of the Town as adopted and amended by the Board of Selectmen.
6. THE MISUSE OF A RESIDENT BEACH STICKER SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - a) The resident sticker number not matching the registration number of the vehicle that it is attached to.
 - b) Attempting entry to the beach with the sticker not permanently affixed to the front bumper or windshield on the driver's side or vehicle.
 - c) Sticker being altered, defaced, copied or made readable.
 - d) Sticker being used to gain entry to the beach by persons other than to whom the sticker was issued.
 - e) The giving of a resident sticker to another for unauthorized use.

A first offense for misuse of a beach sticker shall result in a fine of \$50. A second and subsequent offense for misuse of a beach sticker shall result in a fine of \$75. In addition, misuse of a beach sticker may result in removal and loss of the sticker in the discretion of the individuals authorized to enforce these regulations per Section 14 of these regulations. Payment of applicable fines shall be required prior to purchase of a sticker

removed due to misuse. Fines and penalties are imposed under the provisions of MGL Chapter 40 § 21-d.

7. A sticker for the following year will not be issued until the fine for any previous year/s has been paid.
8. In the case of company cars, dealer plates and repair plates, used in lieu of personal vehicles and upon proof of employment, a maximum of two stickers will be issued.
9. Permanent or full time employees of the Town who do not reside in Yarmouth may purchase a resident sticker.
10. Motorcycles must have the sticker affixed to the motorcycle either exposed to vision or stuck to the underside of the seat. It must be shown at each entry to the beach.
11. Mopeds must have a resident beach sticker affixed to the moped to gain entry to the beach or pay the daily fee. Upon proof of a resident sticker, a resident with documentation of moped ownership and a valid registration may request one sticker for the moped ownership and a valid registration may request one sticker for the moped at no charge. Each additional sticker will cost \$1.00.
12. A resident who does not own a vehicle and wishes to be taken to the beach may obtain a sticker affixed to a letter signed by the granting authority. This must be presented to the Booth Attendant at each entry to the beach. The resident must be present in the vehicle and produce picture identification if requested.
13. A sticker letter may be issued for the following reasons:
 - a) The resident does not drive.
 - b) The resident does not own a motor vehicle.
 - c) The resident does not have a vehicle available to them.

The request for a sticker letter must be reasonable and the decision to allow it or not is determined by the granting authority of their designee.

14. The people authorized to issue fines and remove resident beach stickers for misuse will be the Police Department and the Park Supervisor or his designees. A hearing will be granted before the Parking Clerk if the resident is aggrieved by the removal of such sticker and subsequent fine.
15. Upon the recommendation of the Park Supervisor and/or the Parking Clerk, beach stickers may be revoked by the Board of Selectmen.
16. Replacement stickers on vehicles, which have been in an accident, stolen, etc. will be permitted with the appropriate papers supplied (accident report, police report), for a fee of \$5.00. Replacement stickers on vehicles to which you have changed plates, will be

permitted by presenting a copy of the plate return receipt from the Registry of Motor Vehicles, for a fee of \$5.00. Otherwise, the old sticker must be returned in order to receive a replacement for a sticker being transferred to a different vehicle, for a fee of \$5.00, or the full price of \$35.00 must be paid to replace it.

17. Replacement of a misused sticker, as described in Section 7, will be permitted upon payment of the fine.
18. NO resident stickers will be given away free of charge without the Selectmen's approval.
19. The Clerk's office staff shall have the authority to interpret and administer these rules and regulations. Persons dissatisfied with the Clerk's office decision may file a written appeal to the Board of Selectmen.
